


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COVID-19 - Capturing Learning for Community Planning Partnerships

The 'Don't Know' option should be used when you feel you do not have sufficient information about the particular statement to enable you to make a judgment.

At the end of each section there are two comments boxes. The first requires you to provide details of positive examples that support your views on how well the Board is performing in relation to the statements covered by the section (strengths). The second requires you to provide further details of how you think the Board can improve in relation to the statements covered by the section.

CPP Response to COVID-19

1. The CPP can evidence examples of how it worked well together in response to COVID-19.
2. CP Partners have collaborated in new and different ways in response to COVID-19 through Local Resilience Partnerships/Regional Resilience Partnerships (LRPs/RRPs).
3. The CPP can evidence examples of how resources were used to best support hard to reach individuals and communities during COVID-19.
4. The CPP can evidence examples of positive working with the Third Sector in response to COVID-19.
5. The CPP can evidence how it targeted support during COVID-19 through community engagement.
6. The CPP can evidence a consistent and coordinated approach to providing communities with advice and guidance around COVID-19, such as mental health and wellbeing support.
7. The CPP is capturing learning and good practice around COVID-19 to help shape future partnership working, e.g. case studies to support recovery and renewal planning.
